Urban Regeneration

This trip is designed to compliment the GCSE Geography curriculum. Explore the changes from the heyday of the Port of Bristol, through the dark days of dereliction in the 1970's to the regeneration in progress today. Explore the changes in land use and planning policy and debate the economic, social and environmental sustainability of these changes.

Slavery and Abolition
