A unique way for children to engage with this challenging history, this tour is designed to accompany a study of Bristol's involvement with Transatlantic Slavery.

As we cruise around the harbour, viewing areas of Bristol related to this history, we imagine what a slaving journey must have been like for a Bristol ship's boy. Through sound recordings, pictures and questions, we enquire into the context and legacies of this ugly 'trade'.

Classroom resources include maps, picture cards, and indepth information to put this history in context.

Designed for years 5 and 6, this tour is not suitable for younger children.
