Family Day Out on a Budget!

Visiting Bristol doesn't have to break the bank – we offer Family Day Tickets, under 5's travel for free and there are lots of free activities for the kids near the harbour.

- A) If you're arriving into Bristol via the train, we have a sheltered ferry stop just two minutes away from behind the station (17). Walk along the promenade towards the river and walk down the steps to the right of the bridge. If you have any push chairs, fold them up for easy boarding.**
- B) Ask to be dropped off at Prince Street Bridge (11), or if you fancy a bit longer on the boat, Wapping Wharf (10), as these are the two closest stops to M Shed, which is a free-entry museum which captivates the minds of kids and adults alike.**
- C) Catch the ferry from Wapping Wharf and head to the Nova Scotia (6), where you can visit the Underfall Yard museum and learn about the history of the Bristol Floating Harbour.**
- D) If you want to see the Clifton Suspension Bridge, it is only a short walk along Cumberland Basin, where you can see the bridge from afar, and if you turn back via The Pump House (5) you can catch the ferry back into town (make sure to stand at the top of the steps and give us a wave!)**
- E) You can visit St Nicks Market via Welsh Back Landing (13) to explore the market for great value delicious food, or if you've brought a picnic stay on for Castle Park (15) and sit in the green**
